Action Items: Math 180 2-Year Agreement

Math 180

- Math Benchmark/Diagnostic Testing grades 5-12
- Individualized Intervention support
- Build scholars' confidence with mathematics and accelerating their progress to algebra
- Average annual growth of 1.5 years
- Every Block contains a career-based, problem-solving mathematics simulation which allows students to apply the concepts they are learning
